STUDENT MEDICAL AND SURGICAL WAIVER:

I also consent and give permission for my child, at his/her discretion, to participate in counseling sessions while attending this youth trip.

I do release, acquit, discharge, and covenant to hold harmless the staff of Monterey Baptist Church from any and all actions, damages, liabilities arising out of the treatment of any sickness or accident incurred by said child. I also give authority and permission to Monterey Baptist Church staff to inspect my child's room and belongings while on this trip for the safety and protection of all participants if unusual circumstances make such an inspection necessary. I also have read and understood the rules of this trip and understand that my child will be sent home at my expense if he/she does not adhere to these rules.

Trip Rules

1. Students are not allowed off the property of the place we go. In this way, your attention can remain focused upon what God has to teach you while you are with Monterey Baptist Church.

2. Students are not allowed to ride in or on any vehicle. For everyone's safety, all persons will walk. While on campus, participants will not use cars, buses, vans, motorcycles, skateboards, roller skates, or roller blades.

3. Students who are ill or injured must be either in the office, nurse's office, medical clinic or hospital. In the event of illness or injury, students will not be permitted to remain in their dorm rooms.

Students who are ill or injured will be required to rest in the nurse's station or seek medical assistance in the nurse's office or medical clinic until they are able to return to the regularly scheduled activity or session of their school. This allows us to be certain that your physical and health needs are met.

4. Students must indicate what medications they will use; students are not allowed to share any medication with any other student. All medications each student uses or brings with them are to be listed on the Registration/Medical Release Form and checked in to trip staff. Students must not share any medication, including aspirin or other pain

relievers, or any other over-the-counter or prescriptive medication, with any other student. This protects the safety and liability of the students and staff.

5. Students MUST be in the dorm each night, Monday through Thursday, by 10:45 PM. Lights out at 11:30 PM.

All students are required to be inside their assigned dorms by 10:45 PM, not one minute later. Dorms are locked at this time, and there are no acceptable excuses for not being in your dorm by 10:45 PM. Your curfew is for your safety and for your mental and physical well-being, and because the daily schedule is very demanding—you'll need your sleep. Curfew applies to ALL students and Sponsors.

6. Under NO circumstances are girls to be in boys' rooms or boys in girls' rooms. This includes hallways outside these dorm rooms, too.

NO EXCEPTIONS!

7. Drugs, alcohol, any form of tobacco, any type of paint, firearms, knives, or any other kind of weapon, or fireworks are NOT allowed. These items can be destructive to you, to others, and/or to the campus property.

ALSO, DO NOT BRING tape players, radios (including clock radios), CD players, televisions or any other type of electronic games or equipment,

paggers, cellular phones, or computers. By leaving these things at home for one week, the distractions of every day life can be set aside while you direct your attention to God's Word.

8. Clothing should reflect a Godly attitude, and not divert the attention of those around you from their focus on God's word and His purpose in their lives.

Casual clothing is acceptable during all activities at church and trips. Sleeveless shirts, blouses, or dresses will not be allowed for either boys or girls. Shorts (for boys and girls), skirts and skorts (for girls), must be no shorter than fingertip length with arms and hands straight down at sides while standing. Low-cut dress necklines and/or sheer clothing are also not allowed. Shorts are allowed as long as they are the appropriate length. Persons wearing clothing determined to be too short or too revealing will be asked to change. Repeated disregard for dressing appropriately may be considered a violation of the rules. Remember that you will be seated in small groups—usually on the ground—several times throughout the day (even after the worship service), and choose clothing that will allow you to be comfortable during those times.

9. Students must wear name tags at all times. Each Camp participant will be issued a name tag upon arrival at Camp, which is to be worn during all meals, sessions, and other activities during the day. A replacement fee of \$5.00 may be charged for replacing a lost name tag. Your name tag is your ID badge throughout the week that allows you entrance into campus buildings—and it allows us to learn your name more quickly. We'll ask that you wear your name tag above the waist so it can be easily seen.

10. Refrain from Public Displays of Affection (PDA) with girlfriends or boyfriends. This is a week to work on your relationship with God, so put the relationship with your girlfriend or boyfriend on hold for a week.

11. Students must obey all rules and regulations. We are guests on the campus, and must abide by their rules and regulations concerning dorms, dining halls, and all other facilities. Be respectful of the faculty, personnel, and students.
